Sahakara Dharma Peetam is on the "SahakarDharmBharathYathra", started On 23-12-2020.

You are well aware, that the Cooperative economic system is one of the Economic system, i.e., 1. Private Sector, 2. Public sector and 3. Cooperative sector. Cooperative sector is the resultant of the Directive Principles Article 39(c) and Article 43 of the Constitution. It is the embodiment of the ideals of the Preamble of our Constitution. Hence, the Cooperation became the Aspiration of the People and the Hope of the Farmer. Therefore, Cooperation is not the political issue. Cooperatives protects the members from the exploitation of the Private sector and makes him economically self-reliant.

Sahakara Dharma Peetam is a DharmikaSamstha, propagating the values and the ethics of the Cooperative principles and its concept. Dharma is not established, unless the Cooperative dharma is practiced. Sahakara Dharma Peetam is aimed; to impress the Policy makers to create the favorable Acts and Rules for the development of the Cooperative movement in India.

"SahakarDharmBharathYathra" was flagged off by the **Chairman of Telangana State Cooperative Union Ltd. Sri Ch. Devender Reddy** on 23 Dec. 2020, in the presence of **Sri KonduruRavinder Rao**, now the **Chairman of NAFSCOB**, Navi Mumbai and also the President of TSCAB and greeted by all the Presidents of the District Cooperative Central Banks in Telangana State. It is being lead by **Sri SambharapuBhoomaiah**, Sevak of the Sahakara Dharma Peetam to make awareness on the following issues.

Awareness on the following issues:

1. Withdraw the Section 12(1) of the Banking Regulation (Amendment) Act-2020.
2. Enact a new Act the **"Cooperative Development and Regulatory Authority"**.
3. Every State should bring the **"Cooperative Deposit Guarantee Scheme"**.
4. Re introduce the Cooperative Subject in Primary School level to University level.
5. Let us re introduce the **"Thrift Deposit"** source of own Capital and strengthen the Cooperative Banks.
6. Let every PACS/FSCS increase the **I.M.B.P.** (Individual Member Borrowing Power) to Rs. 5 – 10 lakhs.
By amending the bye-law of the Society to Short Term Agriculture loans.

7. Promote the “Agriculture Produce Processing and Marketing Cooperative Society” for each Block/Mandal and tie up it with the PACS/FSCS.
8. Adopt a “Human Resources Development (HRD) Policy for the PACS”.

Since the Govt. of India issued the notification for adopting the Banking Regulation (Amendment) Act-2020 to the State Cooperative Banks and the District Central Cooperative Banks/CC Banks from 1st April, 2021, the SahakarDharm Bharat Yathra program is minimized to five to six Centers to cover all the States and Union Territories

- 1). South Zone at Bengaluru, on 9th Feb. 2021.
- 2). East Zone at Kolkata, on 18th Feb. 2021.
- 3). West Zone at Mumbai, on 25th Feb. 2021.
- 4). North Zone at Chandigarh, on 5th March, 2021
- 5). Central at New Delhi, on 18th March, 2021

Accordingly, we motivated the 33 State Coop. Banks and 363 DCCB/CC Banks, covering all the 95,995 PACS of States and Union Territories in India. Further we submitted the Memorandum to all the Chief Ministers, National Political Parties and Regional Political Parties to impress the Govt. of India to withdraw the Section 12(1) of B.R.(amendment) act-2020.

Bringing dharma in co-ops: Sah Dharma Peetam Yatra concludes

Emphasizing the critical role of cooperative in the nation's economy, Sahakara Dharma Peetam committed to spreading cooperative principles and norms among the general public began the "Sahakar Dharm Bharath Yatra", from 23-12-2020, says a statement issued by the organization.

Headquartered in Hyderabad, Telangana, the Sahakar Dharm Bharath Yatra" had been flagged off by the Chairman of Telangana State Cooperative Union Ch. Devender Reddy in the presence of several cooperative leaders. It is being led by Sambharapu Bhoomaiah, who calls himself a Sevak of the Sahakara Dharma Peetam.

In its Yatra the peetam touched five Centers across the nation to cover all the States and Union Territories and it ended on 18th March at the Jantar Mantar in Delhi where its leaders held a press conference.

The peetam argues cooperative is the only system that has the potential to carry out the ideals enshrined in the country's constitution, something both private and public sectors have failed to accomplish. Cooperative not only ends exploitation of man by man but also helps people become self-reliant, it says.

The Yatra, among other things, seeks to raise awareness about the need for withdrawing the Section 12(1) of the Banking Regulation (Amendment) Act-2020, bringing in a new Act for the "Cooperative Development and Regulatory Authority, every state initiating the "Cooperative Deposit Guarantee Scheme" and scores of other steps essential for strengthening the cooperative movement.

The Yatra has also urged chief ministers, national political parties and regional political parties to pressure the Govt. of India to withdraw the Section 12(1) of B.R(amendment) act-2020. Some of its other demands are— every State should bring the "Cooperative Deposit Guarantee Scheme", introduction of the Cooperative Subject in Primary School level to University level.

Sahakara Dharma Peetam says "Let us re introduce the "Thrift Deposit " source of own Capital and strengthen the Cooperative Banks and let every PACS/FSCS increase the I.M.B.P. (Individual Member Borrowing Power) to Rs. 5 – 10 lakhs.'

Peetma is also for promotion of the "Agriculture Produce Processing and Marketing Cooperative Society" for each Block/Mandal and tie it up with the PACS/FSCS.

The Yatra touched Bengaluru on 9th Feb; Kolkata on 18th Mumbai on 25th, Chandigarh on 5th March and finally Delhi on 18th March, 2021. It covered India by dividing it in five zones.

The organizers claimed that the Yatra has motivated 33 State Co-op Banks and 363 DCCBs, covering all the 95,995 PACS of States. "Further we submitted the Memorandum to all the Chief Ministers, National Political Parties and Regional Political Parties to impress the Govt of India to withdraw the Section 12(1) of B.R.(amendment) act-2020", claimed Peetma leaders.
